Назначение КИМ — получение объективной информации о состоянии уровня освоения обучающимися 7х классов Федерального государственного образовательного стандарта основного общего образования по английскому языку для проведения методической и коррекционной работы с целью повышения результативности освоения ФГОС основного общего образования по английскому языку.

Документы, определяющие содержание КИМ:

Структура и содержание КИМ

В КИМ включены 2 устных задания, требующих самостоятельного ответа.

Первое задание — это чтение текста (используются научно-популярные, информационные, публицистические и художественные тексты, на основе заданий $O\Gamma Э$).

Второе задание- участие в условном диалоге-расспросе, состоящем из 6 вопросов, на основе заданий ОГЭ.
